Since joining Lordculture in 2005, Carolyne Krummenacker has been in charge of Interpretative Planning.

Carolyne graduated as an art historian from Ecole du Louvre and Museum of Natural History and specialized in museology. Her successive experiences in French museums allowed her to develop a thorough understanding of how public and private cultural institutions work in various fields: fine arts, intangible heritage, automobile, sport, brand museum... She is particularly interested in adapting the museum offer to the visitors' expectations and needs. She also works on exhibition production and touring.

Before joining Lordculture, Carolyne worked as a curator for the museums of the city of Sannois, where she conducted two missions concurrently. On the first hand, she managed the Utrillo-Valadon Museum and on the second hand, she coordinated the creation of the Boxing Museum, from the conception to the very opening: production of the scientific and cultural project, set up of the first exhibition, preventive conservation, publication of the catalogue, definition of the communication strategy.

Previously, the organization of several exhibitions for the Montmartre Museum in Paris (*Steinlen*; *Russes, artistes de Saint-Pétersbourg à Paris*; *Aux beaux Temps de la Butte*) allowed her to work with different European museums and many private collectors.

As a member of the team that conducted the visitor study of the *Visions du future* exhibition in Grand Palais, she learnt the techniques of visitor studies and interviews. The direct interactions she had with children during an internship at the Cité des enfants (Cité des Sciences et de l'Industrie) in Paris firmly fixed in her mind the idea that mediation may be adapted with finesse to all visitors.

Carolyne participated in several scientific publications on art history and museology. She regularly intervenes in conferences.
